3. HOUSE KEEPING & OPENING COMMENTS

Te Nehenehenui (TNN) Chair welcomed everyone to todays hui, those present and those joining online and noted the following opening statements:

4. CHAIRPERSONS REPORT

Chairpersons report provided by Bella Takiari-Brame.

Key Highlights:

- i. Acknowledgements to the Maniapoto Māori Trust Board (MMTB), its long history of 32 years, those before us, those who are still here today including kaimahi and their whānau for their dedication and mahi over the years.
- ii. TNN was established, 17 October 2021. Acknowledgements to Lee Gray, TNN Interim Establishment Director who led the development and implementation of our transition plan.
- iii. April 2022, TNN welcomed Sam Mikaere as the new Establishment Director.
- iv. TNN are currently in the last month of transition from the Maniapoto Māori Trust Board to TNN.
- v. Announcement of TNN Subcommittees, Independent Chairs, and members who are all of Maniapoto descent.

 - Sheree Ryan, Independent Chair of the TNN Audit & Risk Committee

- vii. Acknowledgements to Keith Ikin and confirmation of his resignation as a MMTB trustee from the 21st September 2022.
- viii. Acknowledgements to TNN Deputy Chairperson, Kruger Wetere and fellow trustees, for their dedication over this past year.

5. ESTABLISHMENT DIRECTOR REPORT

Establishment Director report provided by Samuel Mikaere.

Key Highlights:

- i. Since the signing of the Trust Deed on October 17th, 2021, Te Nehenehenui Trust has set out to ensure the infrastructure was in place ensuring a successful start upon Royal Assent.
- ii. Update provided on transition roadmap.
- iii. Confirmation that all current staff of MMTB will transition to TNN.

6. FINANCIAL REPORT

Key Updates:

- i. Financial year end for TNN, 31 March
- ii. Total Revenue: \$131,675,359. Note: the establishment trust is only able to hold this money in term deposits and cannot make any decisions until the first trustees of TNN are appointed. Until then, the establishment trust will be developing the Statement of Investment Policy and Objectives (SIPO).

Pātai Session 1: The Chair opened the hui for pātai.

- A) Where is the provision for marae and hapū at a formal level?
- The Chair referred to the structure of TNN and the representation of Ngā Kura Tau within, which will be comprised of seven trustees, one from each Whare o Te Nehenehenui. The purpose of these seven where is to represent and support the activities of whānau and hapū at a regional level.
- b) What were the mana enhancing processes in terms of the disestablishment of MMTB and has this been completed in terms of the employment of TNN kaimahi?

The Chair reiterated the confirmation from the Establishment Director that all kaimahi will transition to TNN. It is TNN intention to ensure that our whānau are looked after in a mana enhancing way as we move through this transition.

- c) Why does Te Awamutu sit outside of Te Nehenehenui and who made this decision? Tom Roa provided context to this noting, that our traditional boundaries do extend to Auckland. The Waikato-Tainui settlement formed a boundary at the Pūniu awa. Therefore, the Crown cannot negotiate past the awa and we should also respect this with our Waikato-Tainui relations. This does not mean that we don't have interest in Te Awamutu, we work alongside our huānga when any issues arise in these shared areas.
- d) Do MMTB assets transfer to TNN?

The Establishment Director confirmed this, noting:

- i. Royal Assent is when the assets of MMTB transition to TNN end September 2022.
- ii. Settlement Date is when the full settlement package is transferred to TNN November 2022.
- e) How can we try and ensure that we optimise our tax credits?



Because TNN is listed as a Māori Authority, we can redirect the Māori Authority tax credits as a distribution to our charitable arm once established.

f) Under MMTB we were listed as beneficiaries, are the people listed as beneficiaries and do we have to fill out another form to register with TNN?

In the Trust Deed, registered members are listed as beneficiaries. Those registered with MMTB will automatically transition over to TNN.

g) What is the term for trustees on TNN?

Establishment Committee will end 2023. For the new board:

- The first Kura Rere members: 3-year term
- The first Kura Tau members: 2-year term

This will enable the rotation to be staggered from then, going forward. From the second election, the trustees will have a 3-year term.

The maximum term that any trustee can stand for is three (3) terms, they then must stand down for one (1) term - following this they can stand again.
